Man on a Mission

Paul was a man on a mission! We know of 3 missionary journeys Paul and many of his friends took to share the good news of Jesus Christ. His on-the-ground work helped spread the Gospel to "the ends of the earth." Paul traveled more than 10,000 miles and helped to establish at least 14 churches. The book of Acts in the New Testament records Paul's missionary work. Paul helped to establish the early church, especially for Gentiles.





Visions from God



Find the words below and trace Paul's route to Macedonia in the maze.










Family Fun
