During his ministry on earth, Jesus spent a lot of his time teaching and serving his closest friends. He even washed his disciple's feet. That may sound like a weird thing to do for your friends - you might get some weird looks if yous start scrubbing on some toes the next time you're at a friend's house, but back in those days, they wore sandals and their feet got incredibly dirty. It was the job of servants to wash the feet of their masters before a meal. When Jesus did this for his friends, he lowered himself to the job of the lowliest of the low. What an amazing example of how we should serve our friends.

## Gladys Aylward

Gladys dreamed of being a missionary and sharing with others the truth about Jesus. When she applied to be a missionary in China, she was told that she couldn't go. Determined, she heard of an elderly missionary woman who needed a young helper.

During WWII, Gladys found many children whom needed homes and decided to adopt them. She had over 100 children in her care when her town became too dangerous to stay in. She and the 100 children travelled through the mountains on foot to escape the danger. God kept them safe even though they had no food or water.

# Jim Elliot

Jim Elliot was a normal kid. He made the decision to follow and obey Jesus with his life when he was 6. After graduating college, he felt called to be a missionary to people around the world and decided to move to Equador. The Acua people are a remote people group in Equador. They had never heard about Jesus because they were known for violence towards outsiders. Jim put together a group to visit with this villiage and share the gospel with them. Jim and the five men in that group were killed shortly after making contact with the them. Months later, Jim's wife, Elisabeth returned to the villiage to forgive them for killing her husband and tell them about Jesus.

## **Eric Liddell**



Eric Liddell loved to run. Good thing, too, because he was fast! He was so fast that he qualified to go to the Olympics! There was only one problem. His best race was the 100 and that heat was set to run on a Sunday. Eric believed that Sunday was a day to worship and honor God and refused to run on that day. Many people were angry with him for his decision not to run, but God honored it by allowing him to qualify to run the 200 and 400 instead. With God on his side, he won gold in the 400 and bronze in the 200.

Eric wasn't done honoring God with his life in the Olymics. As a child of missionary parents in China, Eric returned to China to continue his work teaching at a school in China and telling people about Jesus. Even when the work grew dangerous, Eric continued to honor and serve God with his life. During WWII, Eric was taken to a prison camp where he later gave his life.
