Have an honest conversation with your parents about your obedience. Ask them to help you see any times this past week where you may not have obeyed your parents.

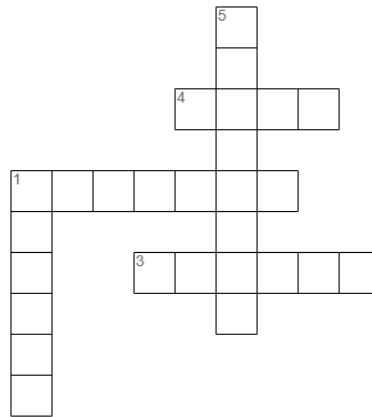
Then, thank your parents for training you to be more like Jesus. Pray that God would help you to choose obedience to your parents this week.

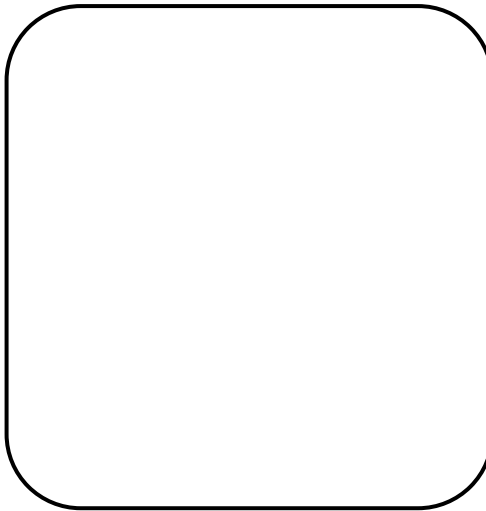

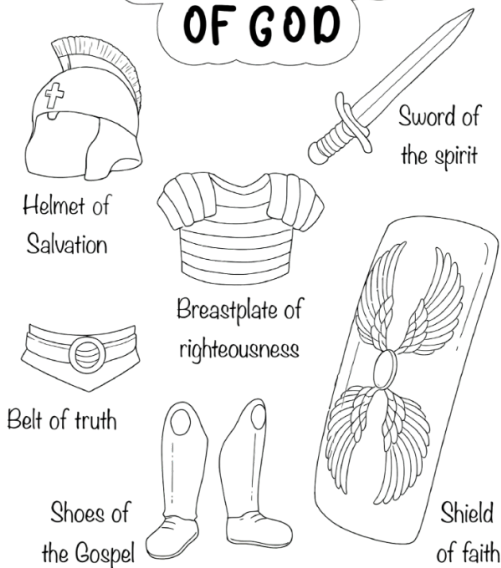

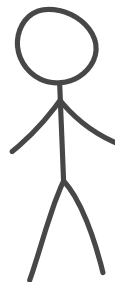


## Read Ephesians 4:20-32

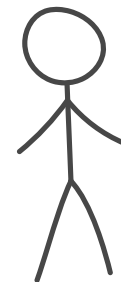
Since we have been saved, our lives should look different from how they did before we knew Jesus.

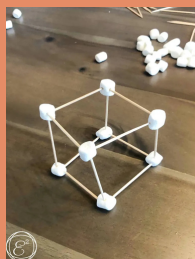


## Read Psalm 118:22 & Ephesians 2:19-22

3. Make placemats for meals at nursing homes.

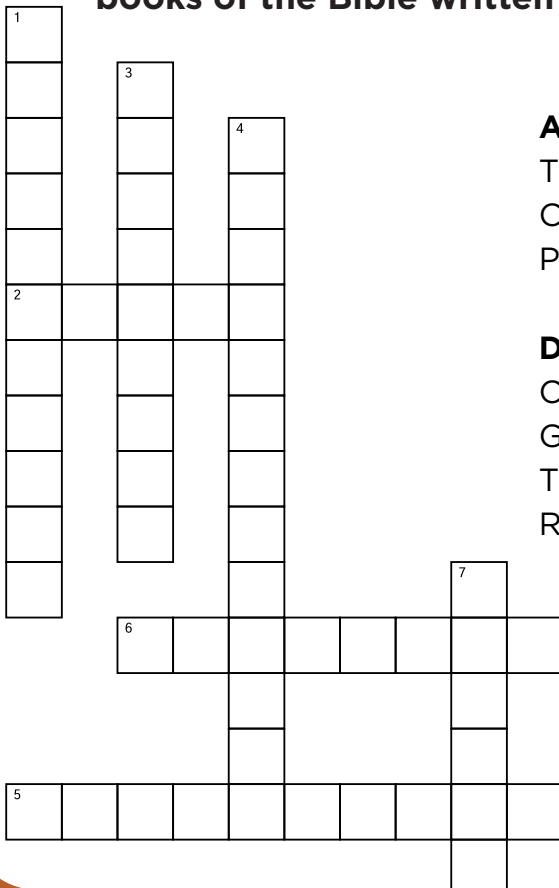
**Read Philippians 2:12-18**
