This series explores how the Spirit forms the Church into a bold, prayerful, gospel-centered community, unified in love and sent with purpose into the world. As we trace the unstoppable advance of God's kingdom, we will see that the same Spirit who empowered the early Church still equips us today to live joyfully missional lives under the gracious reign of King Jesus.

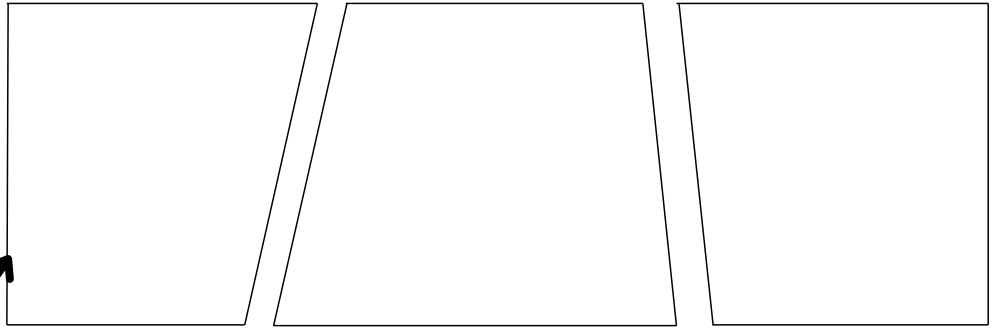

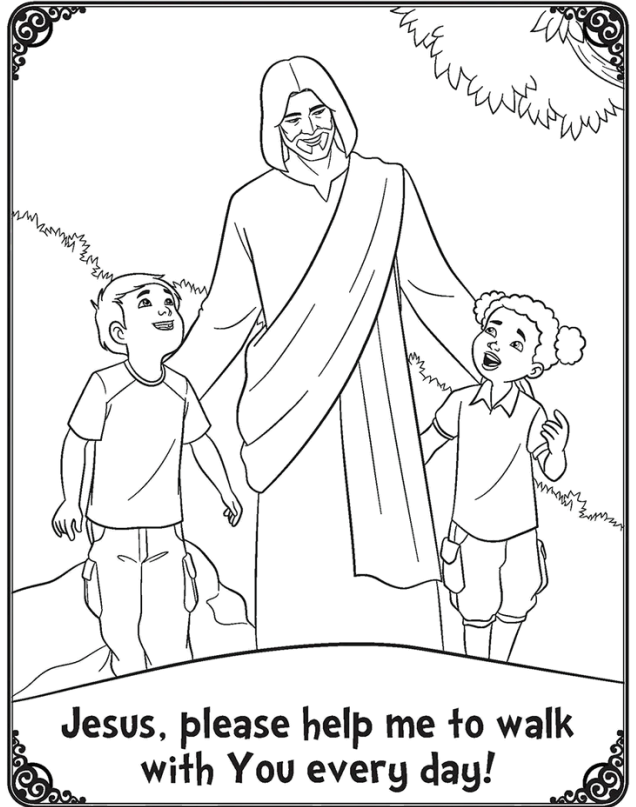

# 2 Timothy

Paul wrote this letter to Timothy during a very difficult time (he was in prison for teaching the gospel), but he still gave thanks to God and wrote of his hope in Jesus Christ.

## Read 2 Timothy 3:1-5

In verse 2, there is a list of things that people do that are *not* honoring to God. One of those is being “disobedient to parents.”

Have an honest conversation with your parents about your obedience. Ask them to help you see any times this past week where you may not have obeyed your parents.

Then, thank your parents for training you to be more like Jesus. Pray that God would help you to choose obedience to your parents this week.

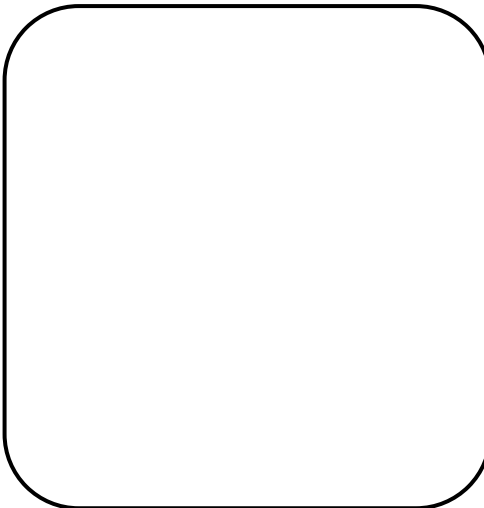

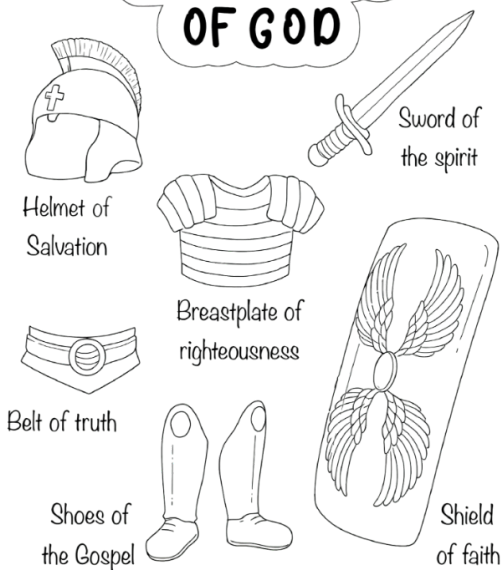

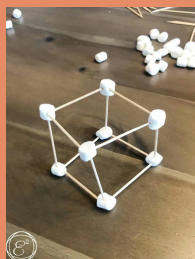


## Read Psalm 118:22 & Ephesians 2:19-22

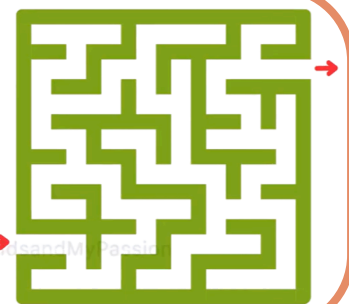
Jesus is our cornerstone!

3. Make placemats for meals at nursing homes.

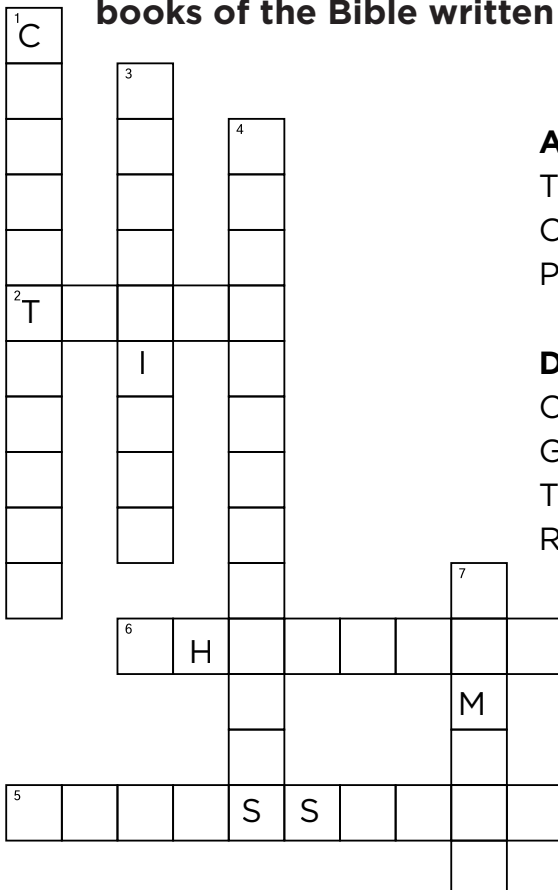
Read **Philippians 2:12-18**
